The PAL Coalition of the 7th Street Corridor (PAL stands for the three neighborhoods, Park Hill, Algonquin and Old Louisville), encompasses four census tracts and includes partial zip codes 40215, 40208, 40210.

On October 13, 2009, Congressman John Yarmuth announced a federal funding grant award for the next 5 years to support Center for Neighborhoods' Drug Free Communities (DFC) project in Louisville. The funding will directly support the 7th Street Corridor PAL Coalition's mission by involving and engaging our local community to help prevent and reduce alcohol, tobacco and marijuana abuse among youth.
