DISTRICT 9 NEWS

The Brownsboro Road Reconfiguration and sidewalk project will add sidewalks along the north side of Brownsboro Road from Ewing Ave. to Lindsay Ave. by reducing a lane of traffic.

- **Crosswalks at signalized intersections (N. Ewing**

Ave., N. Clifton Ave. & Haldeman Ave.) are to be marked with high visibility markings to improve pedestrian safety.

- An evaluation of the existing sidewalk on the south side and curb ramps will be made to determine adequacy in meeting ADA requirements, and deficiencies will be corrected.
